



Advanced Practice in End of Life Care

This module will be taught at the Marie Curie Hospice, Liverpool. It provides a unique opportunity to enhance the student's knowledge and understanding of how dying patients are cared for within specialist palliative care and includes the contribution of specialist clinicians to the teaching programme

The module consists of a series of workshops that will be delivered using a variety of methods: formal presentation, group discussion and group activities. In addition, this module uses blended learning to enhance the learning and teaching afforded by the workshops. The use of e-learning will enrich the quality of student learning through the use of interactive learning activities beyond those attainable through face-to-face classroom interactions.

A key element is the opportunity for participants to access the resources relating to the Liverpool Care Pathway for the Dying Patient (LCP) provided by the Marie Curie Palliative Care Institute (MCPCIL). The LCP is recommended by the Department of Health as the best practice model for care of the dying.

Individual reading, research and reflection are an integral part of the learning process.

This 20 credit module is available as a

Continuing Professional Development (CPD) module or as part of the MSc in Medical Science which allows healthcare professionals to structure their studies to meet their own professional needs. This programme contains specific pathways and exit points including:
